IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

1. All appeals must be sent through CORS.
2. Do not send repeated appeals for the same module if the initial appeal has been declined.
3. The department is unable to interfere with the bidding process to admit students. If a module is fully subscribed, students could either (a) continue to monitor the bidding queues and place bids should vacancies arise, or (b) bid for modules that are still under-subscribed. Bear in mind that the likelihood of getting into fully subscribed modules, especially after CORS has ended, is negligible unless the module is required for graduation.
4. A student who is supposed to be in a particular year of study, but whose student status shows that she is one year behind may not be able to select certain modules for bidding. For example, if a module is opened to ARS3 students in Round 1 and ARS2 students in Round 2, a student in her third year of study, but whose status shows as ARS2, will not be able to access the module in Round 1. In such instances, the student should appeal via CORS as soon as possible and indicate the module(s) that she would like to select. Up to 5 modules may be listed in the appeal. The Department will then grant bidding access for the module(s). A student who has appealed to the Department to grant bidding access should not select the module(s) for bidding on her own. If she does, then the CORS system will not allow the Department to grant bidding access for the module in an earlier round than the student's status permits.
5. A student who has returned from the Student Exchange Programme (SEP) may not get her record (e.g. results while on SEP or modules mapped during SEP) updated in time to bid for certain modules that require the module(s) taken during SEP as prerequisites. Students with this problem should write in to the Department at psybox1@nus.edu.sg as soon as possible, providing the module mapping form and the official or unofficial transcript or result slip, as well as indicating the modules that they would like to select for bidding.
6. FASS undergraduates may be allowed to use, in lieu of their level-4000 modules, a maximum of 2 level-5000 modules (subject to department's approval and module pre-requisites, if any) to fulfill graduation requirements. No level-5000 ISMs or level-6000 modules will be opened to undergraduates. This limit was imposed from Semester 1, AY2008-09 onwards to all students regardless of cohort. Students who have read more than 2 level-5000 modules prior to Semester 1, AY2008-09 will be allowed to use the excess level-5000 modules read to fulfill their graduation requirements.
